
## **Out&About**



ore than 40,000 people will gather at Honolulu's Ala Moana Beach Park on May 31 for Lantern Floating Hawai'i, a surprisingly intimate event that honors ancestors, remembers lost loved ones, and evokes world peace and harmony. Led by Her Holiness Keishu Shino Ito, the opening ceremony begins at 6:30 p.m. and features Japanese taiko drummers, a shomyo choir chanting Buddhist hymns, and Hawaiian hula. As the sun sets, individuals commune in quiet reverence as more than 2,000 reusable candle-lit lanterns, carrying messages of love and hope, are released into the gentle surf. Attendance is free and open to all. The Hawai'i Convention Center provides free parking from 9 A.M. to midnight, and free shuttle bus and handicap-accessible vans are available from 4 p.M. to 8:30 p.M.
